## Justice & Peace group

Love in Action Programme. Our (final) theme this month is 'Community Participation': how to be a positive presence and build community within our parishes and where we live and work. Within our communities, we're called to truly be present. By getting involved, we're contributing to our community, our society, we're helping others, and we're helping Christ. Collect a 'Take-Home sheet' from the Justice and Peace team and think about how we can respond to the needs of our local community in the light of what we're learning in Love in Action.

Diocesan Conference: Last weekend three parishioners attended the Justice and Peace day at the St Philip Howard Centre, Crawley. The topic was "Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery'. There were talks and workshops given by representatives of Sussex Police, The Santa Marta Group, The Apostleship of the Sea and 'Streetlight' Crawley who collaborate in addressing this serious problem within local communities. If, at any time, you see someone or a situation which prompts you to feel uneasy and think there may be a problem of this nature, do contact the police for the harm to victims is substantial.

The Homeless St Peter's Coffee Morning raised £158 with a further generous donation of £100. The Curry Night for The Vine raised £178 as well as giving their

budding chefs experience. Many thanks to all who came and supported the events.

**Brick Fund** Project 5 Guildford provide emergency shelter and ongoing support to help the homeless into independent living. Donating to a 'Brick Fund' will assist their clients to meet the initial cost of £1000 approx. needed to acquire independent rented accommodation. Carefully assessed clients agree to repay the money gradually to enable others to benefit also. We suggest donations of £1 per brick. See board in the church entrance area.
