European Elections - 23 May

The advocacy group Right to Life, have launched a campaign to encourage people to vote pro-life this European election on May 23rd. They have developed an easy to use tool to help find out where MEP candidates stand on abortion.

Although it is likely that elected MEPs will only hold their positions for a short period of time ahead of the UK leaving the European Union, it is still important to find out their position on abortion. Many of these candidates will likely go on to stand as MP candidates in UK elections in the future, so demonstrating to them that abortion is an important issue to many people in the UK is very helpful. Finally, if there is a further delay to the UK leaving the European Union, this increases the likelihood of a vote on abortion happening during the time this group of MEPs are sitting at the European Parliament, so having a larger group of pro-life MEPs there will help secure better numbers on a vote.
