## Justice & Peace group

**Abortion Clinic Censorship Zones.** Last week the Court of Appeal heard how law-abiding citizens are being criminalised for attempting to politely offer help. Ealing Council's representative stated clearly that the intention behind the censorship zone was to prevent both the very presence of anybody who is pro-life but also 'silent prayer'. One judge clearly realised that this means in effect, a blanket ban on prayer. The implications of this case are massive for citizen's rights to pray, to assemble, give and receive information, offer charitable help and to free speech. We expect the judgement to be handed down in late September or October.

**Christian Solidarity Worldwide.** Over 300 million Christians suffer persecution, including death. Parliament have received calls for the Aid Budget to help persecuted Christians.
